#### The Principal's Post — December 2014



Teams are awarded one point for every attendance at a game and three points for winning a competition, two for 2nd place and one for 3rd.

This is a fantastic achievement and the PE department would like to thank everyone who has participated this term!

#### **GCSE Certificate Evening**

Our annual GCSE Certificate Evening was exceptionally well attended with 142 of the

2014 Graduates welcomed back to the Academy with many more guests than ever before. The graduates were presented with their certificates in the Septimus Hall in celebration of their incredible GCSE examination success; the best ever! It was also good to hear how well they had settled into their post-16 placements, although I am sure many would have wanted to remain with us to continue their studies. Graduates purchased their Year Book on the evening and were shown the Leavers' DVD, put together by Mr Smailes, who had also created a montage of photographs from Results Day and the Leavers' Ball which pupils have as part of their Leavers' Book.



Our Guest Speaker once again was Katy Storie, who engaged our graduates with her presentation about having the confidence to be proud of being unique and to strive to be the best they could be in whatever they chose to do. Katy has captained the England 'A' team, played 24 times for the senior England team, won a record four consecutive Six Nations titles and three European Championships and narrowly lost out in the World Cup final in 2006.

As well as the GCSE certificates we awarded our usual in-house certificates for Progress, Outstanding Progress and Subject Excellence. This year we issued nine pupils with Overall Outstanding Progress (exceeding their target grades in 6 or more subjects) and an astonishing 73 additional pupils with Overall Academic Excellence (achieving A\*/A grades in 6 or more subjects).

There were also nine pupils who achieved full marks in a GCSE examination, including two pupils who received full marks in more than one subject.

We are delighted to be able to award yet another new in-house certificate for those pupils who achieved 100% attendance for the entirety of their time at secondary school. Again, the request for an award such as this came from parental feedback. 35 pupils achieved 100% attendance for Year 11; three of these pupils had 100% attendance for Years 7 to 11 which is an amazing achievement

#### **PTA Christmas Fayre**

Due to last year's incredibly success event, the annual PTA Christmas Fayre took place this year on Thursday 27th November in the Septimus and Sports Hall. There were more stalls than ever with Christmas crafts, gifts and cards, jewellery, toys, sweets, cakes and many more.
