Where two adults have shared responsibility for a child, they should agree before submitting the application which schools to name as their preferred schools and the order of preferences. If parents fail to agree on preferred schools and two applications are received for the same child from the same parents, then the LA may decide to put a hold on both applications reducing the chances of that child gaining a place at a school.

Sunderland Application Form

Points to Note

Sunderland Local Authority (LA) operates a co-ordinated admission scheme with other admission authorities within the city (i.e. CE + RC Aided Schools and Academies) and with neighbouring LAs, including Durham, Gateshead and South Tyneside LAs.

You can submit only one application for consideration, which should include preferences for Aided schools, Academies and schools in other neighbouring LAs. You may express up to three preferences. If any of your preferences are for a school other than a Sunderland Community School, then we will contact the appropriate admission authority of that school to enable a decision to be made on your application. If you live in Sunderland we will notify you of this decision on the 'offer day' 1. March 2019, If you live outside Sunderland but apply for schools within Sunderland then your home' LA will notify you about the outcome of your application on

In respect of admissions for September 2019, Sunderland LA will operate an 'equal preference' system. All Community and Voluntary Aided Schools and Academies will consider all preferences equally. This means that all applications will be considered against the school/academy's admission criteria, no matter whether they are 1st, 2nd or 3rd preferences.

Therefore you need to consider very carefully which school/academy you wish to apply for and only list schools that you would like to be considered.

Voluntary Aided (VA) Schools and Academies

You need to be aware that other admission authorities. eg, Voluntary Aided (Roman Catholic & Church of England) Schools and Academies have different admission policies and admission criteria to Community schools in Sunderland, which decides how they will offer places. Their respective admission policies can be found in the booklet. You will need to consider the admission policy for any VA school or Academy you express a preference for, whether this is in Sunderland or a neighbouring authority, in order to determine what system and criteria each individual school will use to consider your application.

Late applications

If you return your application form after 31 October 2018, your application will be considered as 'late' and you should be aware that this will reduce your chance of gaining a place at the school that you want.

When considering an application for a school place, only the address of the Parent/Legal Guardian/Foster Carer will be taken into account. You should be aware that each Admission Authority reserves the right to seek proof of address and to withdraw an offer of a place, if any inaccurate information or address is given on the

If you change your address after the submission of your form you must contact us immediately to let us know. We may ask you for proof of address if necessary.

Receipt of Applications

Please make sure that you are given a receipt when you hand in your application form.

Advice A telephone number for help and advice about the application process for all schools is listed on the front of this form. For advice on the admission policy of Community Schools in Sunderland you can ring this

Make sure you clearly identify:


- a "Looked after Child" or a child previously accommodated by a Local Authority following which they immediately became subject to an adoption, child arrangement orders, or special guardianship order.
