Aidan Eggleston, Class of 2018 got in touch after the 2022 issue went out to share his journey post-Sixth Form. Please get in touch if you would like to share your own story for future issues.

"I originally left Whitburn with an offer from Leeds Beckett University to study Architecture. Because of my A-Level results, I unfortunately did not get into a Newcastle-based University, which was where I originally wanted to be. But as you always said, the route to success is not always a straight path. I excelled in my education throughout my first year at Leeds and reapplied to Northumbria. With a year of creative experience behind me, I was delighted to be accepted and restarted my Architecture degree, graduating in July 2022 with a 2:1 and I couldn't be happier.

Training for an Architecture qualification takes a minimum of 7 years, requiring a 12 month placement between my undergraduate and masters degrees. I am very pleased to say that I have secured a 1-year contract as an architectural design assistant at Ryder Architecture in their Newcastle office. Ryder were the practice that were commissioned to design Whitburn Sixth Form! It is a privilege to be working with the industry leading professionals that helped to design the Sixth Form and assist them with projects alike.

Architecture is a brilliant career path to start on for anyone hoping to progress into the creative industry. Throughout my degree I gained skills in graphic design, photography, drawing, communication, knowledge of software and IT, and many more. Other students on my course went on to peruse careers in animation, graphic design and even set design, showing just how many opportunities an architecture qualification can provide. A lot of my knowledge about the architectural industry and the training process involved, I acquired through my own research".





Case study: Rachel Wilson, Class of 2018

"I am Rachel 2018, a very proud former student and now permanent teacher in the English department at Whitburn.

Teaching was always the job for me and I had always dreamt of coming back to Whitburn and teaching. A dream that became a reality in 2020 when I interviewed (on Zoom of course) to be the ITT (Initial Teacher Trainee) in the English department.

I completed my teacher training with Durham SCITT (School-Centred Initial Teacher Training). I was supported thoroughly by my mentor as well as the whole staff team, and I could not recommend school direct teacher training enough.

So, I am about to go into my second year of teaching at Whitburn. Teaching is everything I expected, never boring, extremely rewarding and challenging. I love it.

Recently, I have also taken up a district role within my Teaching Union and am hoping my contribution will make the future of education extremely bright".
